

# UNIVERSITY OF TORONTO ARCHIVES AND RECORDS MANAGEMENT SERVICES

### **MISSION**

University of Toronto Archives and Records Management Services (UTARMS) is dedicated to acquiring, preserving and making available the documentary heritage of the University of Toronto as a permanent resource in support of operational, educational, and research needs of the University community and the general public. While promoting the fullest access to information we are bound to protect the privacy of individuals and corporate bodies entrusting their records to our care and to maintain the highest possible standards of professionalism and archival practice.

### **MANDATE**

University of Toronto Archives and Records Management Services is responsible for the appraisal, acquisition, preservation and use of University records of permanent value and the private records of individuals and organisations associated with the University. UTARMS works co-operatively with other permanent campus archives programmes devoted to preserving their sponsor's documentary heritage. As well as providing a research service, the department provides an administrative service through the development and implementation of the University's records management programme. The objectives of this programme are detailed in the Terms of Reference of the Presidential Advisory Committee on Archives and Records Management.

### 1. INTRODUCTION

This report documents the activities and achievements of University of Toronto Archives and Records Management Services (UTARMS) for two fiscal years, 2000-2001 and 2001-2002 and marks the mid-way point in the department's *Plan for 2004.* Achievements were made mainly in the areas of identification and acquisition, access to information and preservation of information, with some advances in other areas, namely, client services, information systems and external partnerships.

While the volume of acquisitions from both university and private sources met all expectations, there was little progress in developing a systematic approach through the advancement of records management initiatives for university records, or an acquisition strategy for private records. The inactivity of the Presidential Advisory Committee on Archives and Records Management since the retirement of its Chair in 1999 has prevented the emergence of a proactive programme to identify and schedule the bulk of university records in offices of the three campuses. In spite of this, the one FTE (contract) assigned to carry out existing services has continued to attract continuing interest in consultation, training and the transfer of inactive records to the UTARMS. We continue to operate in a reactive mode for the most part with regard to private records acquisitions as well, and as in previous years, two FTE are required to devote a disproportionate amount of their time to appraising and processing these gifts –in-kind for income tax purposes.

A significant achievement during this period was remote access to our holdings through the World Wide Web. For the first time, a database of all archival accessions was made available on-line through the department's web site in 2000. Late in 2001-2002 copies of finding aids in PDF format became available through the web. In spring, 2002 researchers were provided with an on-line Image Bank of archival photographs to mark the University's 175th anniversary. This was achieved by a partnership with the Department of Development and Alumni Affairs wherein the UTARMS received \$10,000 to hire a cataloguer for six weeks. A much larger project to digitise the Robert Lansdale Photography Ltd. fonds was begun with the remaining funds of a bequest, but it is not yet available on-line. Additional funds are needed to complete the digitisation of images as well as professional staff to build the descriptive database.

While electronic tools have improved access to information, the continuing demand for one-on- one contact by members of the university community and the general public with UTARMS staff has continued unabated. The assistance of Assistant University Archivist Harold Averill in particular, and UTARMS staff in general to researchers involved in such projects as the University history, Faculty of Applied Science and Engineering history, Hart House history and the 175th anniversary celebrations are seen as essential to the success of these projects. The challenge however is balancing changing researcher needs with unscheduled transfers of university records and private donations requiring hours of labour intensive arrangement and description. With staffing levels unchanged for the


past five years, UTARMS remains fifth among peer institutions in North America. This ranking will not improve without an increase in base funding and the active participation and support of the University's senior management in this department's long-term goals and objectives.

### 2. ACQUISITIONS

### 2.1 Collection Growth<sup>1</sup>

A goal of approximately 600 metres (or 2000 cu. Ft) had been projected for the five-year period beginning in 1999. Over the first three years (1999-2002), a total of 565 metres (1853 feet) have already been received, ensuring that by the end of the 5 year plan UTARMS will have exceeded its goal. During the two- year period of this report, UTARMS acquired a total of 376 metres (1234 feet) from university and private sources. The average accumulation of 188 metres (617 feet) per year is consistent with the 189 metres (620 feet) received in 1999-2000. The acquisition of university administrative records amounts to approximately 66% of collection growth.



### 2.2 University Records (A Accessions)

As indicated above, the acquisition of university records from various offices across the three campuses continued to outpace all other sources. From 2000 to 2002, a total of 247 metres (811 ft) were acquired in 46 accessions compared to only 33.25 metres (109 feet) of university records in 1999-2000, an increase of 743%. During these two years, a number of university offices took steps to clean out on-site storage areas when space became an issue. Among such offices were Human Resources (4 accessions; 73.43 metres), the Office of the Vice-provost, Planning and Budget (1 accession, 32 metres), OISE/UT (1 accession, 30 metres) and the School of Graduate Studies (1 accession, 55 metres). ### 2.3 Private Records (B Accessions)

The volume of private records received from individuals and organizations relating to the history of the University declined considerably over this two-year period. A total of 112 metres (367 feet), or an average of 60 metres per year was received between 2000 and 2002. This contrasts sharply with the 152 metres (499 feet) received in 1999-2000 alone. While the volume may have declined, the significance of new acquisitions continued to enhance the stature of our holdings. Among the larger acquisitions were the final donation of personal records of the late professor H. Gordon Skilling (11.20 metres), the personal records of Professor L.E. "Ted" Jones (10.37 metres), and the personal records of Dr. J. Alick Little (21.2 metres). The latter accession documents Dr. Little's research work on lipids, including his tenure as director of the LIPID Research Project at University of Toronto/McMaster University. See Appendix B for a complete listing.

### 2.4 Special Media Records (Table 1)

As in previous years, photographic records were the predominant type of special media received over this two-year period. Prints, negatives and slides totalled nearly 12,000 items, 4 times the volume received in 1999-2000. A large percentage of these were received with multi-media private records accessions such as the L.E. Jones personal records and the H. Gordon Skilling personal records. Smaller accessions included some of the oldest items such as a group portrait of University College Natural Science Association dated 1884 showing Prof. Ramsay Wright and a young Lash Miller, the University of Toronto Varsity Baseball Club of 1888, and a collection of glass lantern slides depicting University faculty, staff and buildings, ca 1870 to 1899. The acquisition of a mid-nineteenth century watercolour by Daniel Wilson of "Brown Square" was another important addition to our collection of this former president's artwork. Other media received during this period included over 100 works of art, eight moving image records (film and video) and 165 sound recordings.

### 2.5 Donations for Monetary Evaluation (Gifts-in-kind)

A total of 41 gifts-in-kind were evaluated for income tax purposes for the 2000 and 2001 income tax years. The total value of these was \$223,425 (2000: \$118,125; 2001: \$105,300). Certification was received for two donations submitted to the Cultural Properties Review Board. See Appendix C for a complete list. Since 1999, UTARMS has received donations evaluated at more than three-quarters of a million dollars.

### 3. RECORDS MANAGEMENT

### 3.1 Presidential Advisory Committee on Archives and Records Management

This Committee was dormant during this period. No new chair has been appointed following the retirement of Dr. J.D. Dimond in October 1999. Holly Yoos resigned her position as records analyst in June 2000. On November 1, Loryl MacDonald was appointed to a two-year contract with funds from central University budget. This position received approval for continuing funding beginning with the 2002-2003 budget. Funds will be provided from the Administrative Priorities Fund of the University.

### 3.2 Training Sessions

The UTARMS continued to deliver training sessions to administrators on various information management topics. Except for a brief hiatus in fall 2000, sessions were offered almost every month by UTARMS. During this two-year period, 16 training sessions were delivered to a total of 211 attendees. In addition to the standard presentations on Records Management, the University of Toronto's File Plan, and Managing Desktop Records, Holly Yoos and her successor, Loryl MacDonald also made three presentations on the University's records management programme to the University Business Officers training programme. In February, 2001, Loryl MacDonald and Harold Averill made a one-hour presentation to Hart House staff on UTARMS records management and archival programmes.

### 3.3 UTARMS Web Site - Records Management section

In the spring of 2001, Barb Edwards and Loryl MacDonald updated some of the UTARMS web site pages concerning records management. Unfortunately, records schedules have still not been loaded onto the department's web site. This will be a priority in 2002-2003.

### 3.4 Consultation and inquiries

Phone and mail inquiries relating to the various elements of the records management programme continue to be a dominant activity. During this two-year period, the records analyst/archivist responded to 461 inquiries ranging from storage boxes to file plans to records scheduling and disposition. In addition to phone and mail assistance, the records analyst also provided on-site consultation and advice on best practices for record keeping including assisting in planning staffing for an office project. In 2001, Loryl assisted Holly Yoos (in her new position as Senior Records Analyst, Development and University Relations) in interviewing and hiring a Records Analyst, Mukumbira Mathali. Assistance was also provided to Mary McGee of the Office of the Vice-Provost, Planning and Budget, in interviewing and hiring an Information Resources Assistant, Modesta Galvez, to complete that office's File Plan Project. Loryl also served as a consultant to Ms. Galvez on University records management policy and procedures. In addition site visits were made to various University offices. These offices include: Disability Services, the Faculty of Medicine's

Department of Development, the Faculty of Nursing, including the Nursing Research Unit, the Office of the Vice-Provost Planning and Budget, the School of Graduate Studies, the Office of the Registrar at U. of T. Scarborough Campus, Governing Council, and the Finance Office and Eastern European Studies Programme in the Munk Centre for International Studies. Four of the above offices requested on going consultation in order to discuss applying file plans to their records.

### 3.5 Ontario proposed Privacy of Personal Information legislation

In January 2002, the university community began reviewing draft legislation issued by the Ministry of Consumer and Business Affairs relating to the protection of personal information collected, used and disclosed by organizations in both the profit and not-for-profit sectors of Ontario. This proposed legislation was prepared in response to the federal government's *Personal Information Protection and Electronic Documents Act (PIPEDA)* which would affect Ontario organizations by January 2004, if provincial legislation were not implemented. Garron Wells attended two meetings and prepared submission material on archives as a member of a small working group to draft the University of Toronto's response to this legislation. The Secretary of Governing Council, Louis Charpentier, chaired this group,. In addition, Garron attended a meeting of the Council of Ontario Universities dealing with the university community's response to this legislation. The legislation is expected to be presented to the Legislature in September 2002.

The impact of this legislation on UTARMS' operations as a repository and research centre are expected to be sweeping. The current draft sets down strict parameters governing the collection, use and disclosure of information containing personal information. Personal information is defined in the draft legislation as "... information about an identifiable individual and includes personal health information and employee personal information, but does not include organisational information or professional identity information". Thus the only personal information that is public includes "... the name, title, contact information and professional designation of an individual that identifies the individual and includes description of the professional or official responsibilities of the individual and the manner in which the individual carries out those responsibilities."

Records containing personal information that are protected under this Bill would be closed for 100 years after the record is created or 20 years after the death of the individual about whom the record relates. As a result the majority of university records in UTARMS dated from the early 1900's to the present may be closed to research. Furthermore, ministry officials have indicated that they feel that the personal papers of individuals and organizations that are not created by the sponsor and are collected by an archives will also be subject to this legislation. Negotiations by the University community as well as the Ontario archives community (represented by Loryl MacDonald, in her role as President, Archives Association of Ontario) continue with the Ministry to resolve the issues relating to research use of historical records held by archives.

### 3.6 Guidelines for Archiving web sites

In the spring of 2000, Garron Wells prepared the initial draft of Guidelines for archiving web sites for the U. of T. World Wide Web Home Page Co-ordinator Committee. Since the launching of the web some 6 years ago, the University of Toronto has created more than 500 web sites accessible through its home page. These Guidelines were developed to assist university administrators in assessing the long-term value of university information written and posted to departmental web sites with the utoronto domain. They are based on similar documents developed in the United States and the federal governments of Canada and Australia. The web has become an essential administrative tool for the distribution of information to students as well as faculty and staff. It is important that all staff involved in the production and management of this information identify what information on the web is an official record or a copy of an official paper record. The Guidelines provide a risk model for assessing the long-term value of official information that administrators have posted to their web sites. A final version of the Guidelines was posted to the UTARMS web site in the summer of 2000. The University of Toronto is one of a very few organizations to have such guidelines available.

### 4. ARRANGEMENT AND DESCRIPTION

### 4.1 University (A Accessions) and Private Records (B Accessions) (Table 2)

### 4.1.1 University (A Accessions)

Among university records accessions received during this period were records of the Office of Human Resources. As a result of space constraints in the basement of Robarts Library, some university offices were forced to find other storage facilities for their inactive records. As is often the case when offices face space constraints, the Office of Human Resources contacted UTARMS to determine the archival value of their inactive records. As a result UTARMS staff spent approximately 10 working days selecting, packing and inventorying over 40 metres of employee case files for permanent retention. Another 33 metres of pension ledgers, employee cards and death and estate files were also accessioned as a result of this project.

Organisational change at the School of Graduate Studies resulted in a transfer of 55 metres of student records covering the period 1916-1992. UTARMS staff work on these records was minimal since the office complied with departmental procedures and provided the required box list. This was not the case with records of the Ontario Institute of Studies/UT. These records arrived without any listing and in containers unsuitable for proper long-term storage. As a result two full-time archivists and an ALT spent 5 working days re-boxing and inventorying over 30 metres of Board of Governors records covering the Institute's 30-year history prior to its merger with the University. The failure of an office to co-operate in the management of its records of permanent value is rare. However, it serves to underline the limitations of the authority of UTARMS and its staff to compel senior administrators to plan, fund and resource all aspects of the management of their information resources.

In other work Lagring Ulanday prepared finding aids for selected accessions as part of the UTARMS Backlog Project. In the department's *Planning for 2004* it was estimated that the project would take one FTE approximately 5 years to complete. Since no additional staffing has been acquired for this project, it is expected that this project will take considerably longer to complete. By the end of this reporting period, Lagring had completed finding aids for three accessions for the Office of the President: A1979-0042, A1979-0047 and A1983-0035. The Office of the President accessions were selected with the objective of updating the *Inventory of the Office of the President* first produced in 1989. Work will continue to complete work on the remaining six accessions requiring finding aids. A revised *Inventory* will be produced for on-line access.

### 4.1.2 B Accessions (Private Records)

As described in Section 2.3 above, UTARMS continued to receive private records mainly from current and retired faculty members. Since approximately 50% of all private acquisitions undergo monetary evaluation for income tax

purposes, detailed finding aids are required. With the Assistant University Archivist still seconded to the University History Project (See Section 5.2), a succession of contract archivists assisted in the processing of a number of these acquisitions. During 2000, Ellen Scheinberg assisted Marnee Gamble in the arrangement and description of the L.E. Jones personal records. The first accession received from the estate of Prof. Jones, a former member of the Faculty of Applied Science and Engineering and Faculty archivist, consisted of over 30 metres of predominantly unorganised papers, books, photographs, memorabilia, sound recordings, cartographic and moving image records. The original finding aid for B2000-0020 was revised in 2001 when an additional acquisition was received from the estate. The final series level finding aid describes approximately 11 metres of personal and professional records created and collected by Prof. Jones following his retirement in 1972 up to 1998, a year before his death.

In 2001, Marie-Josée Lévesque arranged and described three accessions: Francess G. Halpenny (B2000-0023, 1.79 m.) and Thomas P. Morley (B2000-0035, 0.85 m) for the 2000 tax year and Alan Irving (B2000-0022, 3.56 metres) for the 2001 tax year. Among new acquisitions were the papers of sociologist, Metta Spencer, arranged and described by Marnee Gamble. Records in this accession document Prof. Spencer's involvement in peace activities along with some of her talks and publications, including tape recordings of interviews by Gwyn Dyer, journalist and friend.

In the fall of 2001 and spring of 2002, Harold Averill completed the arrangement and description of gifts-in-kind to existing fonds of professors Thomas Howarth (architecture) and Prof. Harold Gordon Skilling (Political Science). The latter accession of more than 10 metres covering the period 1828 to 2001 consists of three sous-fonds: Skilling family, Sara (Bright) Skilling and H. Gordon Skilling. The bulk of this accession documents Prof. Skilling's personal and family life and travels, his education, research materials, publications and addresses. The detailed finding aid will provide a framework for the future production of a comprehensive inventory of other accessions compiling the H. Gordon Skilling fonds.

### 4.1.3 Finding aids conversion

UTARMS has over 30 years of manually produced finding aids for university and private records describing at various levels of detail, the content of accessions. Over the past two years, Assistant Library Technician (ALT) casual staff have been systematically typing or retyping hand-written and manually typed finding aids into word-processed format. This is time consuming and detailed work that will take many years to complete. However, this work is necessary if these research tools are to made available on-line to the university community and the general public. By the end of this reporting period, over 700 pages had been converted. <sup>2</sup>

In addition to this work, nearly 100 finding aids in WordPerfect 5.1 were converted to MSWord and the formatting corrected as necessary.

### 4.2 Special Media

# 4.2.1 Media Centre Appraisal (A1996-0008) and Sound and Moving Images (SMI) in general

January 2001 saw the revamping of the SMI databases. These are internal department created and managed databases. First, the *Title* database, which contained the *Guide* entries was dumped into DB/TextWorks and made available to all staff. Secondly, the *Conserv* database was also dumped but remains on my desktop. Using the combined fields of these to original databases, two new databases were created that separated the descriptive elements of a title from the descriptive elements of an item (or element). *SMI Title* contains the title information, while *SMI item* contains item level information. Thus, pulling information from both original databases created new records. This was done in anticipation of the work that would be done in describing the Media Centre collection and to avoid the duplication found in the original databases. In March two working databases were created for the description of the Media Centre collection that will later be transferred into the *SMI Title* and *SMI Item* databases.

The description and appraisal of Media Centre titles was undertaken by film consultant, Deborah Tabah, who was hired using funds from the Hunergard Estate. Procedures were prepared and Marnee Gamble and Deborah Tabah refined the databases. From March to June 2001 Deborah appraised and processed all items for the titles designated "Type 1 - About the University". This resulted in a total of 58 titles being described and 98 items. Deborah worked approximately 15 hrs/week. This work basically served as a pilot project for the Media Centre project.

At the end of her term, Deborah spent four days teaching Marnee Gamble various aspects of film inspection techniques and conservation. She also provided Marnee with information on film processes and equipment. These skills and information have already proved useful in managing the sound and moving images collections.

### 4.2.2 175th Anniversary Image Bank

In December 2001, the Department of Development and University Relations, in consultation with UTARMS, suggested the development of an on-line image bank to meet the needs of the University community relating to the 175th anniversary. Marnee Gamble developed a prototype database using DB/TextWorks and Marc Lalonde of the Library's IT department adapted it to a searchable web version. Funds were provided by Development and University Relations to hire an experienced cataloguer to describe the selected images in the database. Carol Elder was employed for six weeks in UTARMS and completed the cataloguing and subject classification of 320 images. These images included those produced for the books *University of Toronto A history* by Martin Friedland and *The Skule Story. The University of Toronto Faculty of A pplied Science and Engineering 1873-2000* by Richard White. In addition, Ms Elder produced a manual of procedures that will be used to add more images as time permits. By the end of May,

2002 the on-line Image Bank database was launched. Members of the University community can place on-line orders for copies of digital images from the Image Bank and the general public may purchase images as well via phone or mail.

### 4.2.3 Graphic Images Database:

Work continued during 2001 on development of this internal database. Throughout the winter, Marnee Gamble completed the updating of accessions descriptions for the remainder of 1986 and most of the 1987 accessions. These 51 new records were dumped into the database. The remaining 10 records for 1986 and 1987 accessions require extensive work to locate the images within a large body of textual records and will be done at a later time. An attempt was also made to review and analyse the descriptions for subject headings in anticipation of the database being mounted on the web site. Unfortunately, although this was possible for the accessions after 1986, those described for the *Graphic Guide* (1965-1985) were not sufficiently detailed to be able to do the analysis. Therefore, updating of these records was begun in May and June. The description of 27 accessions from A1965 to A1975 were updated. Of these six required processing before description could be done. By the end of 2001 updating of all 1999 and 2000 accessions was completed and an additional 44 new records were added to the database.

### 4.2.4 Digitisation Project - Robert Lansdale Photography Ltd. B1998-0033

In June 2000, the department embarked on its first major digitisation project. The Robert Lansdale Photography Ltd. fonds was selected for two reasons: it contains a fairly complete photographic history of the University during the late 20th century (i.e. ca 1961 to 1980), and it consists predominantly of negatives rather than prints and is thus not readily accessible to researchers. This one accession contains approximately 50,000 negatives in various formats ranging from small format 35mm to large format 8" X 10" film. The project was not approached as a preservation project but rather as an access/ reference project since digital technology is not considered by the archival community as a preservation medium. The goal was to make digital copies accessible on-line through the department's web site. Funds for this project came from the Hunergard Estate fund. Over the next 18 months Marnee Gamble, in co-operation with the Digital Studio in the Information Commons, arranged for the scanning of 15,539 35-mm negatives. The 35mm negatives were chosen because they are the most extensive format in the fonds and covered a substantial period in the University's history from 1969 to 1975.

Work on the description of the negatives at the job level began in August, 2001 with the development of a secondary descriptive database (JOB DESC) linked to the item level database (LANSDALE IN PROGRESS). Marnee identified the necessary fields and prepared procedures. Description work was assigned to the contract archivist to do while on reference. This work was continued by Graduate Assistant Library Technician, David Tortell,

during Winter 2002. Marnee Gamble also met with Marc Lalonde in the IT department of the Library concerning the design and functionality of the Lansdale database that would be accessible through the web site. Work on this aspect will continue in 2002-2003, with the intention of launching this database sometime in 2003.

Approximately 20,000 more negatives should be scanned to ensure that all the unique images are available to the university community. Since most of the funds available have now been expended the continuation of this project is in jeopardy. Unless additional funds are found from either internal or external Library sources, no further work will be undertaken.

### 4.3 Theses and Print Room materials

During this period, Barbara Edwards, Archives Assistant, entered data for 503 theses covering the period 1890 to 1960 into the Library's on-line catalogue. In addition, Barbara added 30 books to the UTARMS Library that were catalogued centrally by Robarts, and produced 107 new catalogue entries directly. Within UTARMS managed databases, Barbara created 35 new records in the Serials database in DB/TextWorks. An additional 5.60 metres (or 705 items) were sorted, catalogued, shelved or weeded.

### 5. REFERENCE SERVICES

### 5.1 Reference and Research Services (Table 3)

Reading room activity declined in both 2000-01 and 2001-02 from 1999-2000 levels. The decline in the volume of daily users and accessions use may be attributed to the winding up of research on the University of Toronto history project and other commemorative history projects on campus. (See Figures 1 to 3)

Phone and mail enquiries continued however at similar levels. A slight decline in volume in 2000-2001 over the 3114 enquiries received the previous year was offset by a modest increase of 3.5% to 3229 in 2001-2002. A significant portion of this increase was due to increased inquiries from alumni, public affairs and advancement officers relating to the 175th anniversary celebrations in 2002. Many of these were sent directly by email to Harold Averill as the main contact for sources on the University's history during 2002. Enhancements to the department's web site providing a central email address for enquiries has made this an easier mode of communication for the university community and the general public.

Requests for reprographic services increased significantly during these two years mainly as a result of publication of commemorative histories for the University of Toronto, the Faculty of Applied Science and Engineering and the 80<sup>th</sup> anniversary history of Hart House. Nearly 600 photographic prints were produced over this period as compared to only 138 in 1999-2000.

### UNIVERSITY ARCHIVES ACCESSIONS USE





# UNIVERSITY ARCHIVES ENQUIRIES

### 5.2 University of Toronto History and other history projects

Harold Averill continued his secondment to this project until the summer of 2001. By October 2000, Harold had prepared 72 pages of commentary on the first set of draft chapters written by Prof. Friedland. Between December 2000 and February 2001, Harold reviewed and commented on a second set of chapters producing another 37-page report. After February 2001, Harold's total time to this project declined significantly, focusing mainly on selection and commentary on photographic illustrations. More than 130 images from Archives accessions were reproduced in the book. By the end of June 2001 Harold was able to resume most of his supervisory and archival duties.

On March 14, 2002, UTARMS staff was invited to a dinner thanking all that had participated in the production and publication of *The University of Toronto A history.* While all staff were acknowledged for their assistance to the author and his researchers, Harold Averill was afforded special recognition for his "great font of historical knowledge about the University". The following day, the book was formally launched at a ceremony attended by the university community in the Great Hall at Hart House. Prof. Friedland presented the original manuscript to President Robert Birgeneau for deposit in UTARMS.

In addition to advising author Richard White on sources for *The Skule Story. The University of Toronto Faculty of Applied Science and Engineering 1873-2000*, Harold also read the completed manuscript and helped with the selection of photographs. He also was in constant contact with the editors and writers of the special anniversary issue of the *University of Toronto Magazine* (March-April 2002) and with the group that produced the anniversary banners that are prominently displayed on and near the campus.

### 5.3 Web Site Development

After consultation with other staff, Barbara Edwards made a number of revisions and enhancements to the department's web site. Among these were obtaining a general email address for reference inquiries. This eliminated the need to publish individual email addresses and put better control on the distribution of reference workload to staff members. Preliminary discussions were undertaken with Marc Lalonde in the Library's IT department concerning the mounting of finding aids in PDF onto the web site. A pilot project was then undertaken in early 2002 to identify any technical problems. During these discussions it was also noted that the on-line UTARMS Database was not indexed on the web. The Library's IT Department undertook this.

Other routine editorial work was undertaken to update information on our holdings as well as adding links to a couple of articles to the "What's New" section.

### 5.4 Exhibitions, Tours and Seminars

### H. Gordon Skilling, May 2001

In May 2001, Harold Averill mounted a small exhibition in the Reading Room as tribute to the late Prof. H. Gordon Skilling. Members of his family following a memorial service viewed the exhibit, containing both current and new acquisitions to the Skilling fonds, and the Skilling Seminar held on campus to honour his achievements.

### Daniel Wilson, August 2001

In August 2001, UTARMS arranged to loan 31 items to the University Arts Centre for its exhibition, 'Daniel Wilson, the ambidextrous polymath', curated by Robert Stacey. Many of these items were specially matted and framed by Emrys Evans and Linda Joy in the Thomas Fisher Rare Book Library, and all were packed by the professional art moving company, PACART, and delivered to the Centre. All but five were returned as unacceptable because of a perceived mould problem. Although Mr. Evans took the offending items to the Art Gallery of Ontario where they were inspected by specialists who determined there was no mould present, the items were still rejected by the Centre.

### Discovery Day 2001

Changes in the organisation of the annual event formerly known as U. of T. Day has resulted in less involvement by the Library including the Fisher Rare Book Library building. As a result, UTARMS did not open for this event.

### "Beyond the Microscope" Museum Studies Department, Robarts Library March 16 - April 6, 2001

In March 2001, the UTARMS loaned artifacts, photographs, manuscripts and books relating to the Lash Miller family (B1976-0007; A1993-0012) to the Museum Studies Department. The exhibition prepared by students of the program "explores a historic collection of scientific instruments, their significance and the types of stories they can tell us." The students also used photographs from UTARMS to produce a virtual exhibit on the web.

### 6. PRESERVATION

### 6.1 Micrographics

During these two years, Lagring Ulanday continued to prepare original volumes and review microfilm Senate minutes. In the final year of the project, Lagring worked solely with the vendor, Xebec Imaging, while her supervisor, Garron Wells was on research leave. By the spring of 2002, the filming had been completed for this series of records. Lagring completed all checking of film, shelving and labelling of user copies and a final finding aid. In total, the Board of Governors minutes produced 38 reels of film and Senate minutes produced 23 reels.

In 1999-2000 budget year, the UTARMS received an additional \$20,000 to film 19th century land records (A1968-0010). No work was begun on this project as a result of Garron Wells' research leave, and outstanding work on the Senate minutes project. In 2002, the vendor Xebex Imaging moved its microfilming services to Montreal. It is expected that a new vendor will need to be found in the Toronto area to continue this project.

### 6.2 Storage

UTARMS continued to ship records to a commercial off-site storage facility because of space constraints. During this two- year period all records sent off-site were university records received recently from administrative offices. This amounted to 217 metres (713 cu. Ft). As of April 30, 2002, UTARMS has a total of 2484 cu. Ft (757 metres) or approximately 10% of its entire holdings stored off-site.<sup>3</sup> Any available on-site storage facilities continue to be reserved for new acquisitions of private records.

### 7. ADMINISTRATION

### 7.1 Staffing

Holly Yoos resigned her position as Records Analyst in June, 2000. Loryl MacDonald replaced her on Nov. 1, 2000. Because the UTARMS did not receive continuing funding for this position as recommended by the Chair of PACARM in 1999, the duties of the position were slightly altered to allow more archives work. Garron Wells was on research leave during 2001 and returned to full time duty in January 2002. During her leave, Harold Averill, Assistant University Archivist, was responsible for many routine duties relating to acquisitions and reference and supervision of CUPE casual staffing (two ALTS and one GALT) Marnee Gamble reduced her hours to 80% in September 2001. The salary savings from this position and the University Archivist's research leave helped to cover cost of one GALT position for 12 hours per week for fall/winter 2001-2002.

As mentioned previously, contract archivists were hired with funding from the Office of the Vice-president, Administration during the secondment of the Assistant University Archivist to the U. of T. History project. Ellen Scheinberg (2000) and Marie-Josée Lévesque (2001) were hired for short periods to undertake processing of B accessions and reference work Harold and Marnee oversaw the work of these contract staff. Both individuals proved to be thoroughly professional in their work and ensured that the department could meet its commitments to researchers and donors during the two-year period. Carol Elder was hired for six weeks in 2002 to undertake the cataloguing of digital images for the 175th Anniversary Image Bank.

### 7.2 Closing, 2000 and 2001

During the August 2000 closing all fulltime, contract and casual staff were occupied with the selection, listing and boxing of inactive records of the Human Resources Department (See Section 4.1.1).

In August 2001, Harold Averill and Loryl MacDonald spent several days packing and listing over 50 cu. Ft of records from J. Alick Little and the Lipid Research Clinic. Harold's attempt to identify and/ or process archival material in the Seminar Room unfortunately was postponed while he dealt with the crisis over the Wilson paintings intended for exhibit (see Section 5.4). However he was able to identify, arrange and describe the records of Frederick Ernest Joseph Fry (B2001-0027) and inter-file material of Joan Winerals Fonds

In other work Marnee Gamble reappraised, identified, accessioned or deaccessioned graphic images that had been set aside in the early 1990s. Approximately 38 accessions or parts of accessions were reviewed. Also during the two week closing, the Sir Daniel Wilson Paintings, B73-0043, were individually boxed and reshelved. A new finding aid was also produced.

In the Print Room, Barb completed processing and describing approximately 168 items as well as 80m of backlog serials in the P-Accessions. In addition to assisting Harold Averill in packing the J.A. Little records, Loryl MacDonald conducted site visits to the Nursing Research Unit and the Faculty of Medicine's Development Office. A finding aid for the School of Graduate Studies records was retyped to correct inaccuracies. Lagring Ulanday continued to check new reels of microfilm of Senate minutes.

### 7.3 Professional and Other Activities

During 2000-2001, Loryl MacDonald served as President of the Toronto Area Archivists' Group and attended the Archives Association of Ontario (AAO) Annual General Meeting and Annual Conference on June 15. At that time she was elected AAO Vice-President / President Elect for 2001-2002. In this capacity, she has been involved in the daily administration of the AAO including the hiring of staff. Loryl also served on the AAO's ARCHEION special committee responsible for the development of a provincial on-line database of archival holdings. In July, 2001 Harold Averill agreed to become a member of the Historic Scientific Instruments Committee, a campus-wide committee struck to ensure the preservation on campus of scientific instruments of historical value. Pekka Sinervo, chair of the Department of Physics, chairs it. The committee meets monthly. On November 22, 2001 Harold was interviewed about the history the Division of University Extension for a film being prepared on the history of the School of Continuing Studies. On 14 March 2002 he was interviewed by students from Ryerson Polytechnical University for a public affairs program on the history of the University of Toronto. In 2001 Harold was invited to join the editorial board of the electronic peer-reviewed international journal, History of Intellectual Culture and continues as a member. He also continues to volunteer at the Canadian Lesbian and Gay Archives and to contribute to its newsletter. During this period, Harold also wrote four biographies for Who's Who in Contemporary Gay and Lesbian History, II: From World War II to the Present Day. (London: Routledge, 2001): Bernard René Courte, 95; Charles C. Hill, 188; Robin Metcalfe, 177; and Brian Mossop, 194.

In April 2001, Marnee Gamble was asked by the Library to work on a count of the Alliance Atlantis Media collection and to propose possible shelving layouts for a new on-campus storage facility. By October 2001 she had spent 35.5 hours on this project doing counts, consulting with vendors, attending meetings and developing shelving proposals. Lagring Ulanday continued her position as archivist for the ARMA Toronto Chapter, which included attending meetings, arranging for the transfer of records to the City of Toronto Archives and assisting a volunteer in preparing a history of ARMA Toronto chapter. In 2001 she was the sole representative of UTARMS at the annual conference of the Association of Canadian Archivists in Winnipeg. As mentioned, Garron Wells was on research leave from January to December 2001. During that time she attended the annual ARMA International conference in Montreal and made a presentation at the ECURE (Electronic College and University Records) conference in Phoenix, Arizona on archiving web sites. On campus she made a similar presentation to the U. of T. Webmasters group in April 2001.
